

## **Things To Do in Portland**

Sitting on the northwestern border of Oregon in the Pacific Northwest region of the United States, Portland is known for the vibrancy and uniqueness of its many neighborhoods, each with a distinct sense of place, and—in quirky Portland fashion — spread across six so-called "quadrants."—<u>Travel Portland</u>

Portland Art Museum (\$)	Within walking distance of the Portland Marriott Waterfront, one of the nation's best art museums.
Washington Park	Free shuttle throughout the park with stops at each attraction
Oregon Zoo (\$)	Meet Tula-Tu, the newest addition to the Zoo's Asian elephant herd. Purchase tickets online before going!
World Forestry Center (\$)	Forest-focused museum with interactive exhibits
Portland Japanese Garden (\$)	Offering year-round serenity at a woodland sanctuary in northwest Portland inspired by the flora and fauna of Japan.
International Rose Garden (Free)	Past peak blossoms, it's a century-old garden with 10,000 rose bushes
Hoyt Arboretum	A "living museum of trees" with trails to explore its 2,300 species of trees and shrubs
Pittock Mansion (\$ or free)	Picture-perfect views of the city, hiking trails, and a tour of the historic Portland mansion
Forest Park	70 miles of trails for hiking, runners, and equestrian
Hopscotch (\$)	Theme Park of immersive art exhibits with local snacks & drinks for sale
Powell's City of Books	Large bookstore open 365 days a year
Lan Su Chinese Gardens (\$)	Ming Dynasty-style Garden in Portland's historic Chinatown
Portland Saturday Market	Large out arts-and-crafts fair
Birdie Time Pub (\$)	Indoor mini-golf and sports bar
Guardian Games	Large game store with space to try out games and a bar
