

The Right Tool For The Job

- So you got a message...
- Web Pages: Detailed, formal information
- Blogs: Brief summaries of news; commentary
- Podcasts: Dialogues, interviews...
- Video: Illustration
- Wikis: Community input projects; collaboration
- Social Networking: When you want to generate a buzz with a high profile item
- Mix and match for an integrated approach
- Let's walk through them...



Social Networking

- Who: Teenagers, students and young adults
- Where: MySpace, Facebook, LiveJournal, Blogger, Friendster
- What: Web pages where members write comments which are shared with their "friends".
- Why: One post can be instantly replicated to thousands of journals/ accounts. Also, the demographic is underserved. And the sheer size!
- How: Create accounts ahead of time. Join astronomical "communities" with a welcome message. Then, when the time comes, simply login, post, logout.

The International Astronomical Union's Minor Planets Circular #8747 has been released.


In accordance with the resolution adopted by the IAU about a fortnight ago, **Pluto** has been given a number in appropriate to its status as "a numbered object with a well determined orbit." Pluto's number is **134340**. It is still referred to, of course, as Pluto and is now, along with Ceres for example, part of that class of objects known as a "Dwarf Planet."

Also, 2003 UB₃₁₃, incorrectly referred to as "Xena" for some time now, has been given an official name - **Eris**. Uploading a video is a two-step process—on the next page, you'll be able to choose your video file and set the privacy settings. Generally, uploading will take 1-5 minutes for every 1MB with a high-speed Internet connection. You'll see an "Video Upload Successful" page when it's done, linking to other things you can do with the video while it's being converted, which will take a few minutes.



Results

- Keep track of stats by linking to an image hosted on your server
- Look at Referrer Log of your web site
- Go back to the posts and read the comments
- Some will be interesting and some won't.

Create An Announcement Checklist

- I. Make a web page
- 2. Send e-mail to blog authors (direct; no spam, no CC:s)
- 3. Post blurb to social networking sites (LiveJournal, MySpace, etc.)
- 4. Invite podcasts to interview your scientists or send an audio comment to podcasters (mp3)
- 5. If you have a video, upload to YouTube and Google Movies. If instructional, upload to VideoJug.
- 6. Update Wikipedia's article on your organization and/ or the discovery topic (create new if needed)

"Strategery"

- I. Create accounts on various sites ahead of time. Keep a print out in your desk with usernames/passwords.
- 2. Keep contact list of blogs to e-mail. Keep up good relations with their authors with an occasionally e-mail.
- 3. Occasionally monitor the various social networking sites to get a feel for each community's flavor.
- 4. Keep track of your stats and successes. Adjust according to results.
