Minutes of the 91st Annual Meeting of the AAVSO, Held October 24–27, 2002, Somerville, MA

The 91st Annual Meeting of the AAVSO was held at the Holiday Inn in Somerville, MA, on October 24–27, 2002. The Executive Board and the Council held their meetings at the Holiday Inn on October 24 in the morning and afternoon, respectively.

Attendees were invited for an Open House and Dinner Buffet at AAVSO Headquarters on the evening of October 24. Following dinner, Dorrit Hoffleit autographed copies of her autobiography *Misfortunes as Blessings in Disguise* for attendees.

On Friday, October 25, many attendees chose to participate in the day-long meeting of the International Dark-Sky Association being held at the Museum of Science in Boston. Many stayed for the evening to attend a program in the Museum of Science Planetarium.

The Annual membership meeting was called to order on October 26 at 9:04 a.m. by President Daniel Kaiser. He said that former treasurer Ted Wales was regrettably unable to attend due to illness, and that anyone who wished could sign the get-well card for him. Dan then appointed Gerry Samolyk, Sara Beck, and Ron Zissell to be counters of the ballots for Council.

Secretary Martha Hazen noted that the minutes of the Spring 2002 meeting were not quite finished. They will appear in the Journal [*JAAVSO* 31, 1].

In the absence of Treasurer Louis Cohen, who had an illness in the family, Lee Anne Willson presented the Treasurer's Report. She noted that in the past (thanks largely to Clint Ford) we have been able to fund our activities out of our endowment income. Now, however, we are running a deficit, and we will have to make changes, including finding new sources of income. She announced that the Council has taken this very seriously and has unanimously pledged a total of \$10,000 as a matching challenge for the membership.

A report on the science project at Headquarters was given by Matthew Templeton, the new Postdoctoral Scientist at AAVSO.

Janet Mattei thanked the committee members and chairs for their work.

Director Mattei presented the list of 72 new members accepted at the Council meeting on October 24. She described the current distribution of members and observers; the total membership is now 1,327. She then read several letters from members.

Janet Mattei reported that no members had died in the past six months. However, she mentioned that noted astronomer and friend of the AAVSO, Jesse Greenstein, had died, and asked the membership to stand for a moment of silence in his honor. John Percy reported that Paraguayan variable star astronomer Alexis Troche Boggino had passed away.

The 92nd Spring Meeting will be held in Tucson, AZ, on April 23–26, 2003. A preliminary schedule calls for the Executive Board and Council to hold their meetings on April 23, a field trip to Kitt Peak on April 24, a workshop and town meeting on April 25, and the membership meeting and scientific paper session April 26.

The 93rd Spring Meeting will be held July 20–24, 2004, at Chabot Observatory in Oakland, CA, jointly with the Astronomical League and the Association of Lunar and Planetary Observers. Our host will be Mike Reynolds, Director of Chabot Observatory. The meeting will also celebrate the 35th anniversary of Apollo 11.

The Council has voted to have only one meeting per year as an experiment for the next two years. By our By-Laws we must have an Annual Meeting to elect Council members and receive Committee reports and the Director's report. Thus, there will be a short membership meeting scheduled in late October 2003, and again in 2004, as well as an Executive Board meeting and a Council meeting. There will be no other meeting activities at this time. It should be noted that the balloting for Council has been done routinely by mail in recent years.

Director Mattei then presented her annual report. The report, as is customary, will appear in its entirety in an upcoming issue of the *Journal of the AAVSO* [this issue, p. 184].

President Kaiser reported that Lewis Cook, Jaime Garcia, and David B. Williams have been re-elected and Karen Meech has been elected to Council.

There followed a Town Meeting, at which there was clarification of the one meeting per year policy and then the attendees adjourned for the group photograph.

At lunchtime there was a special Council meeting of old and new members to elect officers for the coming year. All the present officers were re-elected.

Following a lunch break, the Scientific Paper Session convened. The list of papers is attached to these minutes.
